What is your only comfort, in life and in death? That I belong – body and soul, in life and in death – not to myself but to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ.

These words come from the 16<sup>th</sup> century, and are the opening lines to the "Heidelberg Catechism," a statement of faith included in our Book of Confessions. Nearly 500 years later, these are still the words we need to hear and speak and trust.

This has been a summer of deep tragedy and unrest across the United States and across the world. The list of cities continues to grow: Orlando, Baghdad, Baton Rouge, St. Paul, Dallas, Nice. Even as people who watch the news from a distance, it is almost too much to bear. We see the photos. We hear the numbers. And we can feel the pain of families: who long for the arms of their spouse or parent, whose dreams for their children are shattered, whose neighborhoods are torn apart.
