Friends,

Some of you know that over the past two years, I have been working with a small group of leaders in our presbytery to study the congregations and communities that make up this stretch of Southwest Virginia. Our ultimate goal is to listen for who God is calling us to be as a presbytery. Why are we joined together as congregations? What is the mission that God has for us? How do we hold one another accountable and support one another? How should we be organized to best accomplish what God requires? That's what we're trying to address.

A few interesting things I've learned along the way...

- Congregations in Presbytery of the Peaks range in size from 4 members to 1205 members. The median size is 48 (which means the majority of our congregations have fewer than 50 members).
- The largest religious affiliation in this part of Virginia is "None" or "Spiritual but not religious." 28% of our neighbors in southwest Virginia describe themselves this way. Baptists are second at 21%. (3.2% of the population identify as Presbyterian)
- There is a strong desire among Elders and Ministers for deeper relationships, connections, and partnerships among congregations and leaders. People want to support one another and work together.

I am so proud that First Presbyterian has a strong history of Elders and members who are involved at the presbytery level. If you'd like to see how our denomination works at a regional level, or are curious to learn more, please reach out to me! I'd love to help you get involved, or give you a ride to a presbytery meeting.
